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## Nyeri marks World Tourism Day in style

The celebration aims to explore innovative strategies and partnerships to ensure tourism remains a catalyst for global peace and sustainable development. 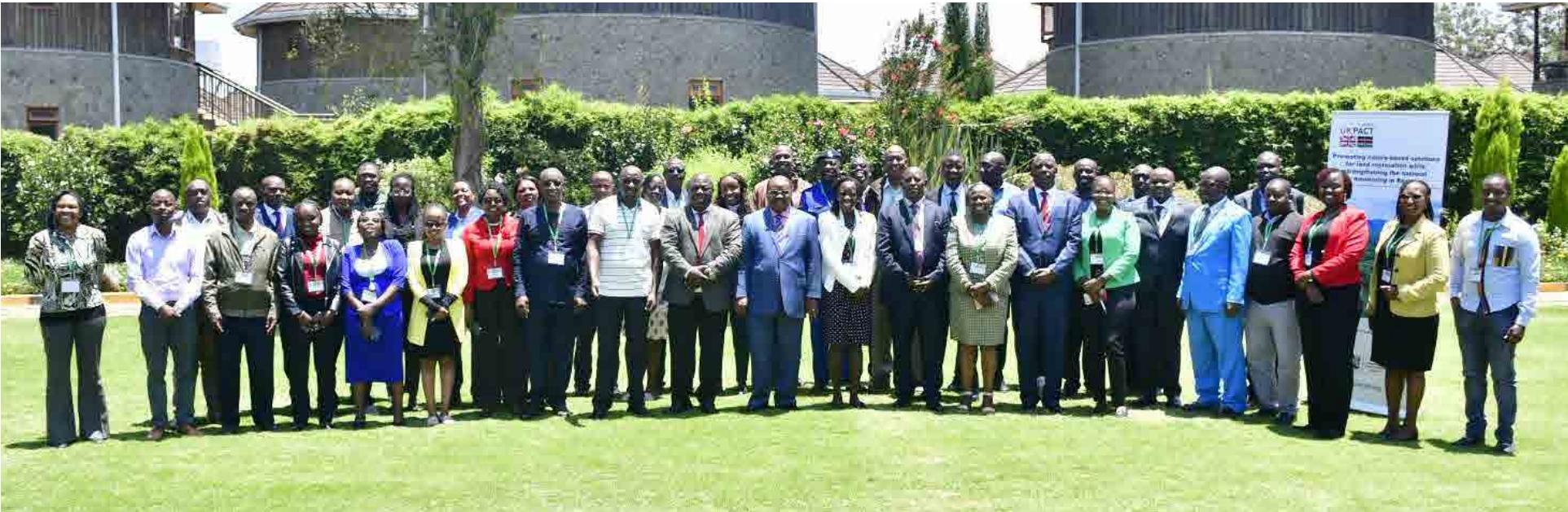
technical capacity of county staff and personnel. Mr. Kaki observed that partnership with the County will foster initiatives towards transparency and fostering public trust in fi-

# Fifth Cohort of interns exit ceremony



Nyeri Governor H.E Mutahi Kahiga presided over the farewell ceremony of the fifth batch of interns, who have completed their one-year-paid internship programme with the County Government of Nyeri.

On 2nd October last year, 199 interns were appointed by the County Public Service Board to serve at the County Government of Nyeri. Out of these, 191 reported to their posting immediately. One year later, 20 of them

were then absorbed by the County Government of Nyeri after undergoing the interview process as per the County Public Service Board regulations.

Throughout their internship period, the interns gained real-world work experience by working closely with their supervisors, getting an opportunity to engage in projects from inception to execution stages.

Further, the County Government endeavored to build

the capacity of the interns through training, whereby they were taken through engagement forums on cross-cutting issues, including Devolved Government Structure and County Government Act, National values and Principles and Public Ethics & Code of Conduct, Drug and Substance Abuse at the workplace, Human Resource Policies and Procedures Manual 2016 and Signing of the Code of Conduct.

The Department of the

County Public Service Management monitors the progress of the interns, facilitates mentorship, and organizes training sessions to enhance their professional growth.

By effectively managing the program, the department ensures that the interns receive meaningful and impactful experiences while also contributing to the county's operations and service delivery.

The program emphasizes professional growth and skills enhancement, ensuring

that the interns have gained practical experience relevant to their fields of study, developed soft skills, including communication, teamwork, and problem-solving, as well as improved technical skills.

The diverse range of activities provided the interns with a well-rounded experience, preparing them for future career opportunities in both public and private sectors.

20 interns were absorbed by the County Government, with 23 others exiting the County public service to join other public and private organizations of their choice.

The remaining 148 interns received certificates and recommendation letters. The program has achieved its primary objective of providing opportunities for youth empowerment and skills development.

Governor Kahiga called upon the interns to remain good ambassadors of the County Government of Nyeri.

He assured them that they will be considered in future job openings since they already have been equipped with the requisite skills required.

# Governor attends CoG consultative meeting on health



H.E. Governor Mutahi Kahiga joined colleague Governors, Medical Services PS Kachuwai Kimtai, Controller of Budget Dr. Margaret Nyakang'o, Deputy Auditor General Edwin Kamar among other stakeholders and partners for a consultative meeting to address pertinent issues on health, financing, budget and revenue allocation organized by Council of Governors (CoG) Health Committee. Some of the contentious areas discussed include: opportunities and challenges

in the implementation of the UHCAct including management of transition from NHIF to SHIF, and how to address them; inter-governmental responsibility of Parliament in the realization of devolution; emerging health policy, legislative, and financial matters and decisions made by Parliament and MoH that negatively affect County governments; the status of implementation of Return to Work Formula (RTWF) between the Council of Governors (CoG) and Health Workers Unions;

and, transition and sustainability of projects and Human Resource for health by County Governments. Universal Health Coverage (UHC) means that all people have access to the full range of quality health services they need, when and where they need them, without catastrophic expenditure. It covers the full continuum of essential health services, from health promotion to prevention, treatment, rehabilitation, and palliative care.

In Kenya, to realize Universal Health Coverage the government enacted four ACTs that provide the legal framework for roll out and implementation of UHC which include:

- Primary Health Care Act that provides a framework for the delivery, access, and management of primary healthcare;
- The Social Health Insurance Act extends health insurance to all Kenyans based on registration, contributions, and through government-subsidized coverage

for the poor;

- Digital Health Act: The Act is a legislative framework aimed at establishing and regulating digital health services in Kenya;
- Facility Improvement Financing Act: The Act provides for public health facility improvement financing, management, and administration. In addition, it aims to ring-fence money generated in health facilities, ensuring a predictable, regular, and steady source of funding for health facility operations in the counties.

It is worth noting that Primary Health Care remains the backbone of our health system, with community health volunteers and primary healthcare facilities playing a critical role. With the passing of the new health laws to support UHC, relevant stakeholders have developed attendant regulations that will ensure the smooth implementation of the agenda. The Governor is committed to providing strategic leadership, guidance, and good governance towards the realization of UHC and the health sector objectives for both our county and country.

## DG hosts DeKUT team

Nyeri DG H.E. David Kinaniri hosted a team from the Dedan Kimathi University of Technology (DeKUT) headed by the former Vice Chancellor Prof. Ndirangu Kioni who paid him a courtesy call. The main agenda of the meeting was the cooperation arrangement between the County Government of Nyeri and Dedan Kimathi University Of Technology (DeKUT). The Origin Research and Innovation Labs, Physical hub of East Africa is hosted by DeKUT. It's an interdisciplinary research and innovation hub aimed at solving complex problems in Africa through ground breaking research,



development and innovation. The objective of the collaboration is to establish a jointly beneficial relationship of partnership and cooperation, that would facilitate educa-

tion, research, innovation, technology and development, transfer and commercialization in the identification of solutions to specific sub-sector challenges, which can be implemented at scale

to contribute to Africa's transformation. Collaborative research projects will address challenges in specified critical value chains including and not limited to: Fish, Coffee, Fruits, Sunflow-

er, Potatoes, Dairy sector, Bananas (postharvest), as well as food safety and product testing. This will improve the lives of Nyeri citizenry in agriculture sector.

# Nyeri Chapter SHA Launch



On behalf of H. E Governor Mutahi Kahiga, Health Services CECM Dr. Joseph Kiragu launched The Social Health Authority (SHA), at Nyeri County Referral Hospital.

Social Health Authority (SHA) will deliver its mandate through 3 Funds namely:

- Primary Health Care Fund (PHC) services under this fund are available for FREE in level 2 and 3 facilities for registered individuals regardless of the payment status;
- The Social Health Insurance Fund (SHIF) - This fund will function similar to NHIF, by pooling resources to cover all Kenyans with enhanced services from level 4 to Level 6 Hospitals, i.e outpatient, inpatient, Maternal, Renal, Medical Imaging, surgery

among others;

- The Emergency, Chronic and Critical Illness Fund (ECCIF) -This fund will provide free emergency cover for all Kenyans. It will also help avoid bankruptcy when one develops a chronic condition like cancer or kidney diseases that require dialysis among others.

Central Region SHA Coordinator Winnie Mbugua underscored the critical role played by CHPs in Preventative Health, connecting the community to essential services while ensuring the Government's health initiatives including Universal Health Coverage (UHC), reach even the remotest areas.

Dr. Kiragu highlighted that CHPs are integral to delivering government health ser-

vices at the community level, acting as the first point of contact between the public and the health care system. He emphasized community education and engagement with Social Health Authority and urged all the community members to register with the Authority so as to access massive benefits at the household level.

He assured all stakeholders of the County's support in ensuring the roll out of SHA was a success in Nyeri County.

"I encourage each one of you to become ambassadors for the Social Health Authority and UHC to ensure that all our Nyeri Citizenry have access to comprehensive health services without financial hardship," he stated.

# Consultative meeting with VAMED - Finland

Health CECM Dr. Joseph Kiragu held a consultative meeting with representatives from VAMED and the Ministry of Health's Tax Exemption Department, who paid him a courtesy call.

The purpose of the meeting was to brief the CECM on the ongoing partnership between VAMED-Finland and the Government of Kenya, specifically regarding their two-day tour of Naromoru and Karatina Sub-County Hospitals.

These facilities are major beneficiaries of this partnership, with the team reviewing the progress of construction and the use of tax-exempted materials and equipment.

VAMED, an international organization based in Finland, is working closely with the Ministry of Health to improve health-care infrastructure in Kenya. Their efforts include the construction and equipping of health facilities, as well as training health-care workers to ensure they can effectively use the newly installed equipment.

Dr. Kiragu reaffirmed the Department of Health Services' commitment to supporting the project through continuous site inspections to guarantee proper implementation and use of resources, with a focus on avoiding misuse or misappropriation.



# Community in-reach program at Kamoko Health Centre

As part of the journey towards achieving Universal Health Care (UHC) through Primary Health Care (PHC), the Department of Health has taken proactive steps to ensure that essential health services are brought closer to the community.

A strategic partnership with AMREF Health Africa under the Project THRIVE has facilitated community in-reach programs within the county, with one being held at Kamoko Health Centre in Othaya Sub-County.

The primary objective of the in-reach at was to provide a broad range of specialized health services to the local community. These services



aim to promote health education, early detection of diseases, and improve overall access to medical care.

The initiative also underscores the Health Department's commitment to advancing UHC by ensuring

community members can access essential healthcare at minimal costs.

The services offered include: Health Education; Diabetes and Hypertension Screening; Nutritional Counseling; Physician Consultation; Paediatric Consultation; Dermatology Review; Eye and Dental Check-Up; Mental Health Counseling; Cervical & Breast Cancer Screening; PSA Testing for Men; with prostate-specific antigen (PSA) testing being conducted thus enabling early detection of prostate cancer.

The community in-reaches reflect the ongoing efforts to bring essential health services closer to the people. By offer-

ing a wide array of specialized services at the community level, the initiative makes healthcare more accessible, especially for populations that may face barriers to visiting larger health facilities.

The initiative also created an opportunity to create awareness on Mpox and its signs and symptoms, urging the community members to visit the nearest health facility for medical attention as well as report any suspected case to the relevant authorities.

The success of this initiative underscores the importance of collaboration in healthcare delivery and serves as a model for future health Primary Care Models in the County.
