Each reported incident represents not just a life lost, but the crushed dreams, potential, and future of women who might have con-

tributed to our society in immeasurable ways. As our sisters, mothers, friends, and colleagues, their lives do matter, and their stories

should fuel our resolve to enact change.

With the recent launch of the Nyeri County Youth Devel-

opment Policy 2023 by H.E the Governor Dr. Mwalimu Mutahi Kahiga PhD., EGH together with Deputy Governor H.E Kinaniri Waroe at the Moi Nyeri Complex School, Nyeri County has on and the necessary pathway to confront this critical issue head on, through addressing the circumstances and challenges that would seek to foster the kinds of situations that lead to gender based violence.

The pivotal role of the Department on Gender, Youth, Sports and Social Services in the realization of this milestone cannot be denied. According to Esther, "This Policy's transformative agenda seeks to address the needs of Nyeri County's Youth population by incorporating their issues into all County policies, programmes and plans, thus ensuring that their voices and concerns are adequately addressed."

Under SGD 3 that touches on good health and well-being, that is, ensuring healthy lives and promoting well-being for all at all ages, the following issues are addressed:

a)Mental Health:

Initiatives to promote the holistic health of young people and develop youth-oriented healthcare.

It shall also address specific health problems faced by young people which inhibit their capacity to participate in society.

b)Drug and Substance Abuse:

Create awareness and reduce alcohol and substance abuse and pornography

among the youth.

c)Sexual and Reproductive Health Rights:

Reduce the incidences of teenage and unwanted pregnancies, and the sequel of unsafe abortion.

d) Sexual and Gender Based Violence:

Enhance Gender-Based Violence (GBV) awareness, and enhance mitigation and response mechanisms.

In line with this Nyeri County through the Department of Gender, Youth, Sports & Social Services took its staff through training designed to equip Gender-Based Vi-

olence (GBV) stakeholders with the knowledge, skills, and tools necessary to address critical issues in gender equality, violence prevention, and related social challenges.

During the session the following key topics were covered:

1. The progress of implementation of the Youth Development Policy, that is, a comprehensive overview on the current state of activities related to the Policy;
2. Triple Threat, that is, GBV, HIV & teenage pregnancies- This session focused on the intersection of GBV, HIV, and teenage pregnancies as a "triple threat" that disproportionately affects vulnerable populations, especially

adolescent girls and young women;

3. Emerging Issues and Trends in Gender, which focused on how the societal dynamics evolve, as well as new challenges in gender and development.

By fostering collaboration, sharing best practices, and enhancing understanding of these interconnected issues, stakeholders will be better equipped to make informed decisions and implement effective solutions for the communities they serve. Not only that, interventions such as these help empower GBV stakeholders to reflect on past achievements, assess ongoing challenges, and proactively adapt to emerging issues in gender-based

violence, HIV, and teenage pregnancies.

Therefore, it is pivotal for all parties not only remember the lives lost due to femicide but also renew the commitment to end this scourge. Government, civil society and people as individuals and communities need to come together to build a safer, more equitable society for all, one that does not victimize of cause a section of its citizens to live in fear. It is only through collective effort that Nyeri County as a community can hope to change the circumstances surrounding femicide and GBV.



Upgrading of Informal Settlements Continues Through KISIP 2

Did you know that the primary goal of the Kenya Informal Sector Improvement Program II (KISIP 2) is to improve living conditions in the selected settlements in Nyeri County?

Well, this is achieved by investing in infrastructure based on plans developed in consultation with the community, by supporting planning, surveying and issuance of land ownership documents to residents of informal settlements, and by strengthening capacity of county administrations to deliver on their mandates.

In Nyeri County, settlements that were selected for infrastructure upgrading under Sub-component 1.2 are Kiamwathi and Chorong'i in Ruring'u ward, Nyeri Central sub-county, Kiawara in Rware ward, Nyeri Central sub-county, Mweiga in Mweiga ward, Kieni West sub-county and Ihwagi in Iria-ini ward, Mathira East



sub-county are undergoing revamping under the Main Works.

As a result, the Department of Lands CO Fredrick Maina led a team from the KISIP II National Project Coordinating Team (NPCT), County Project Coordinating Team (CPCT) and representatives from the Consultant Gath Consulting Engineers and Losai Management Limited in undertaking a site visit to confirm the status of proposed road for upgrading and additional sewer element in Kiawara settlement, Nyeri town sub-county. This was after a team from the World Bank and NPCT conducted an Implementation Support Mission for the infrastructure works. Kiawara settlement is set to have improved access, modern drainage systems, streetlights, installation of two dumpsters, sewer connections and a high mast installation. Main Works are ongoing in the other four settlements.

New Digitization Platform to Enhance Service Delivery to Citizens

The County Government of Nyeri with the support of the World Bank and through the Kenya Accountable Devolution Programme (KADP), is in the process of developing a platform to digitize and integrate its participatory processes and operations.

Following an intensive first of three five-day training workshops themed 'County Digitization of County Participatory Processes' which Nyeri Governor H.E. Muthahi Kahiga, PhD, Nyeri Deputy Governor H.E Kinaniri Waroe were taken through the progress made by the multi-departmental team developing this dashboard, led by World Bank consultants Rose Wangare and Stephen Nyaga.



This platform is designed to enhance service delivery by streamlining citizens' access to services, facilitating meaningful participation in decision-making, and fostering a deeper engagement with governance.

Once fully developed this two-way dashboard will be able to process a range of development, administrative and communication-related tasks including but not limited to: engaging the public on new and ongoing projects, analysing information and data received from the public, feedback exchange including grievance redress, submission of proposals, information -sharing with the citizens, project monitoring and tracking, to mention but a few.

As Nyeri County advances progressively into the digital era, it is worth noting that the operationalization of this dashboard will come with a more streamlined, strengthened and enhanced citizen engagement experience, with citizens having the option to participate and give their feedback online as opposed to attending physical meetings; ensuring minimal interruption to one's daily routine.

At the core of this initiative lies the principle of co-creation, and represents a pivotal step towards establishing a governance structure that is more transparent, accountable and centered on the needs and aspirations of the citizens of this great County of Nyeri.

NewFortis Sacco Members Take Home Kshs. 993.98 Million



H.E. Dr. Mutahi Kahiga, PhD, EGH joined the NewFortis Sacco fraternity during the 49th Annual General Meeting (AGM) held at Nyamachaki Primary School grounds, Nyeri town. Newfortis Sacco continues to be a beacon in the co-operative sector which is evidenced by the phenomenal growth both in numbers and asset base. From its humble beginnings in 1976 with just 857 members drawn from the teach-

ing fraternity, the Sacco has expanded exponentially to reach 22,942 members as of December 2024. The financial performance of Newfortis Sacco has been equally impressive. The share capital has grown to an impressive Kshs. 176.6 Million, while the loan book now stands at Kshs 8.4 Billion. What particularly stands out is the remarkable increase in returns to members. The combined interest on deposits and dividends

paid has grown from Kshs. 220.8 Million in 2013 to nearly Kshs. 1 billion last year. This nearly fivefold increase in member returns within a decade. NewFortis Sacco has embraced technology in its operations. With fully computerized systems, digital loans, SMS banking, and M-loans, thus positioning itself at the forefront of digital transformation in the cooperative sector. "I strongly urge all cooperatives in our county to fol-

low NewFortis's lead in digitizing their systems. This adoption of technology will not only improve efficiency but also enhance member experience and service delivery. I wish to commend the board, management, and members of Newfortis Sacco for your remarkable achievements. Your growth story exemplifies what we can achieve through cooperation and focused leadership." He added. Nyeri County has over 195 active co-operative societies

with a total share capital of over Kshs. 2.4 Billion. The co-operative movement is an important source of employment, economic growth, poverty alleviation and the bright future of Mwananchi. I have made deliberate efforts toward supporting our co-operative movement and it is for this reason that we have continuously increased our budgetary allocation to the sector. "My government has recruited more officers to enhance the supervision of Co-operative Societies and are well-trained to undertake the mandate as envisioned in the constitution. At the same time, I wish to urge the National Assembly to fast-track the review of the Co-operative Societies Act to ensure it is in line with the constitution that gives the Counties the mandate to regulate Co-operative Societies," He added. During the meeting, NewFortis Chairman John Githinji announced to the members that Kshs. 993.98 Million will be paid out as dividends and interests for the last financial year.

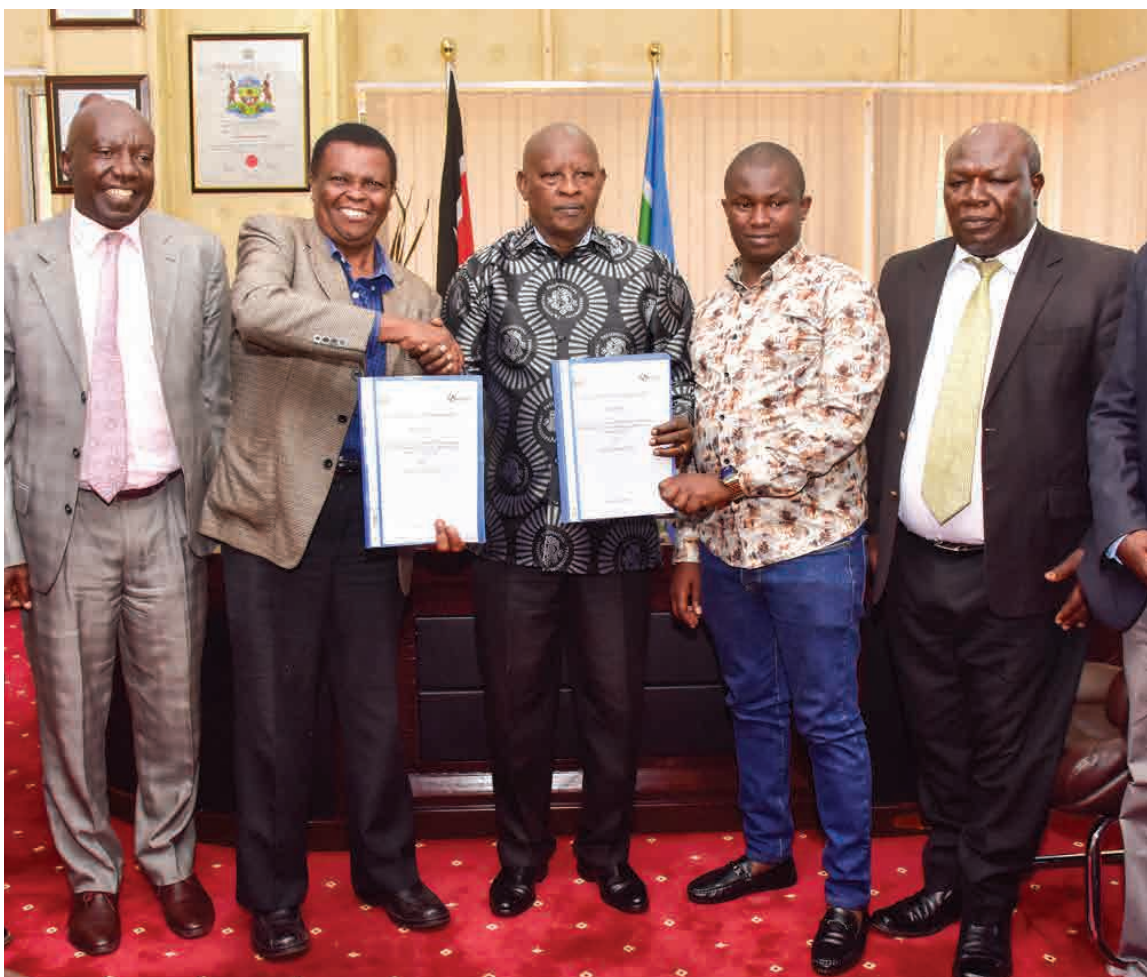

CGN and Kids Alive Kenya Pen MoU

H.E. Dr. Mutahi Kahiga, PhD, EGH witnessed the signing of an MoU between the County Government of Nyeri through the Department of Medical Services and Public Health and Kids Alive Kenya.

Kids Alive Kenya is a faith-based organization in Gatei, Thegu River ward in Kieni East Sub-County that provides physical, emotional, and spiritual care to children and families from areas experiencing socio-economic hardships.

The organization previously used to run a dispensary named ‘Kids Alive Dispensary’ to offer health services to the children under their care and the catchment population of Maragima, Gatei, Karundas and its environs as part of its social responsibility. However, this dispensary was closed in 2016 due to financial and sustainability challenges.



Fortunately, the tidings have now changed. Through the intervention of the Health Department together with the area Member of the County Assembly Hon. Patrick Wachira Kanyi and the larger community, deliberations of a collaboration com-

menced. The discussions have now led to a working partnership that has been solidified through the MoU signed today between CGN and Kids Alive Kenya. Legal Counsel Abigael Njoki from the County Attorney’s office oversaw the signing.

Under the collaborative agreement, Kids Alive Kenya will provide infrastructural support while the Health Department will oversee the day-to-day running of the dispensary by posting staff and providing the various supplies required to run a dispensary.

Under the Nyeri County Health Services Act 2015, the community shall form part of the dispensary’s governance structure through the election of a Health Facility Management committee where the organization shall have a representative to oversee services at the facility.

RE: MASS REGISTRATION FOR SOCIAL HEALTH AUTHORITY (SHA)

The Department of Medical Services and Public Health in Collaboration with the Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government and the Social Health Authority (SHA) has been spearheading the successful roll out of SHA registration in Nyeri County.

This Collaborative effort has seen the County to number 6 nationally with a total number of 188,054 residents registered, accounting for 24.8%, against an expected target population of 759,164 residents, as of 15th January 2025.

To fast track the registration process, the Department is planning a Mass SHA Registration Exercise starting from Wednesday 5th to Sunday 9th February, 2025. This will be undertaken across ALL Government Health Facilities, Assistant Chief Offices, and in selected Churches & Markets in the 8 Sub Counties as per the attached schedule.

We shall be offering all SHA registration services for FREE as well as offering general information on SHA and responding to queries.

Pioneer Child Development Programme Partnership with Gender Department

Pioneer Child Development program is an NGO in the Mt. Kenya West Area that exists to support the deprived, excluded and vulnerable communities, protect children, youth and empower them to become agents of positive change in their communities. The organisation seeks to strengthen the community to access sustainable incomes and resources necessary to meet their basic daily needs while making them resilient to environmental shocks. During the meeting Gender, Youth, Sports & Social Services CECM- Esther Ndung'u emphasized the importance of collaborative efforts to enhance children's rights, youth empowerment and gender equality in Nyeri County. She expressed gratitude for the ongoing partnership with Pioneer Child Development Fund as well as their support towards the Launch of the Nyeri County Youth Development Policy in November last year.



Ndung'u explored potential collaboration opportunities, including joint youth training sessions, community outreach programs, Youth Summit and resource mobilization to support Children, Youth and Gender-Focused projects. The CECM further acknowledged that sharing best practices and experi-

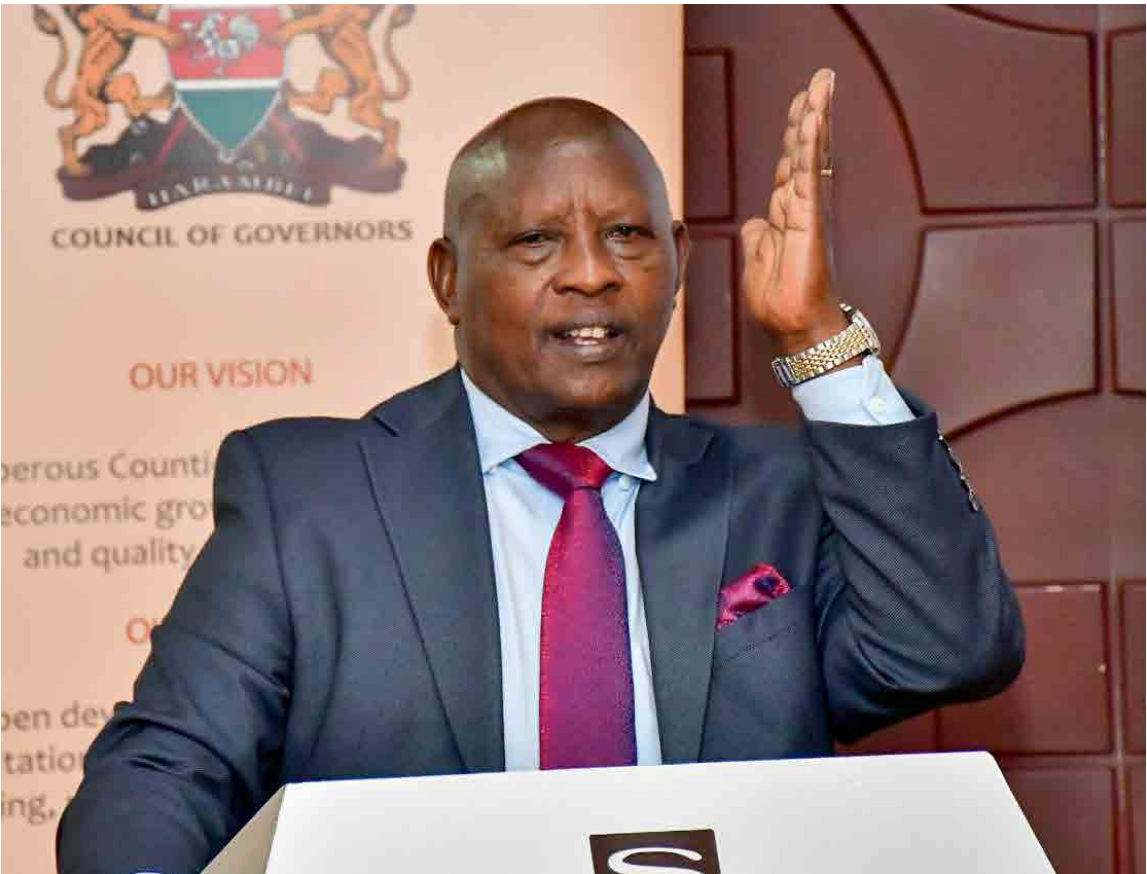
ences would be beneficial for enhancing project effectiveness. "There is a need to develop a memorandum of understanding (MoU) to formalize the partnership and outline roles and responsibilities of each party. We are committed to working closely with PCDP to foster a supportive environment for children

and promote gender equality." She advised. The CECM thanked the Pioneer Child Development team for their openness to collaboration and expressed optimism about the partnership's potential to bring about meaningful change. The Director Pioneer Child Development Programme Mr. John King'ori presented

the current projects undertaken by the Pioneer organization, highlighting the organization's focus on child protection, education, Climate change and empowerment programs that are aimed at promoting empowered and climate-informed communities.

Governor Attends JASSCOM Caucus on Food Security and Nutrition

Both the National and County Governments are implementing the Joint Agricultural Sector Coordination Mechanisms (JASSCOM) to foster cooperation and consultation aimed at enhancing efficiency and effectiveness in the agricultural sector. This collaborative framework is crucial in addressing sectoral challenges, optimizing resource use, and achieving food security and sustainable development. It is in this view that as the Vice-Chairperson, Council of Governors (CoG), H.E Governor Mutahi Kahiga PhD., EGH addressed a sensitization session of the County Executive Committee Members (CECMs) in charge of Agriculture Caucus leadership on the JASSCOM Mechanism to enhance their understanding and imple-



mentation of JASSCOM in the agricultural sector. The discussion centered on food security & nutrition,

and to a greater extent poverty reduction in Kenya, which has always been anchored on the agriculture

sector. "We can address poverty and/or developmental challenges that lie not only in the

strength of our agriculture sector, but also in how we navigate the complex interplay of global policies, national frameworks, and local governance structures and reality. Together, we must ensure that Kenya's food systems are sustainable, resilient, and equitable; ultimately lifting our people out of poverty and ensuring that no one goes to bed hungry," he added. Earlier, the workshop was addressed by the CoG Agriculture and Livestock Committee Chair H.E Ken Lusaka. The Agriculture CECMs Caucus was led by their Chairman James Wachihi who is also the Nyeri Agriculture, Livestock and Aquaculture Development CECM.

WAIVER OF 100% INTEREST ON LAND RATES FOR REGISTERED AND NON REGISTERED PLOTS

WAIVER PERIOD: 20th January 2025 – 19th February 2025.

The County Government of Nyeri with the approval of H.E. Governor Mwalimu Mutahi Kahiga, EGH, PhD, as part of the economic recovery strategy hereby gives notice to all Land Rates defaulters that 100 % interest sums outstanding as at **20th January 2025 – 19th February 2025** will be waived on the following conditions:

That the Rate payer clears in full the total principal land rate arrears and pays 10% administrative costs based on principal amount payable.

All Land Rate defaulters are hereby **WARNED** that upon failure to pay, legal consequences will be instituted which include but not limited to: -

1. Compel Land Rates defaulters' tenants to pay directly to the County Government until the Land Rates and interest are fully paid.
2. Cancel or withdraw any license/permit granted in the premises in which Land Rates have not been paid.
3. Withhold any development approval until full payment of Land rates are received for the said Land.
4. Charge the property over unpaid rates plus interest until the full amount is cleared.

5. Deny all other services offered by the county Government of Nyeri.
