Information Communication and Technology (ICT) refers to the diverse range of tools, systems, and resources used to manage, process, store, transmit, and exchange information, encompassing both hardware (like computers and mobile phones) and software, along with the networks (internet, mobile) that enable their interaction.

ICT focuses on how these technologies facilitate com-

munication and collaboration, playing a critical role in the modern digital world by connecting people, ideas, and services across various sectors like business, education, and healthcare.

Nyeri County is steadily growing its digital innovation, ICT-enabled services, and inclusive technological transformation.

Over the years, Nyeri County has integrated these dig-

ital infrastructure and services into its socio-economic fabric.

This digital push makes it a more efficient and competitive economy, aligning with the country's Vision 2030.

The County Government of Nyeri has a clear vision for growth through partnership with the private sector; both local and foreign, and has laid and continues to emphasize socio-econom-

ic transformation and the well-being of our people.

Inevitably, the realization of this aspiration requires a multi-faceted approach focusing not only on all sector priorities, but also on harnessing opportunities from untapped potential investment areas and resources; both natural and human, that the County is well endowed with.

The Government of Nyeri

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Investment opportunities exist across a broad spectrum of sub-sectors:

-Digital Infrastructure & Connectivity

Nyeri County has invested extensively in laying down state-of-the-art digital networks, both in urban centers and rural hinterlands.

Service providers such as Safaricom have established connectivity across the County, enabling high-speed broadband access, critical for business, health-care and financial services.

Complementing this is the roll-out of free public Wi-Fi zones in major towns, markets, and public parks, enabling people to access digital services and platforms without cost barriers.

The County’s decentralized model includes the ongoing development of ICT Hubs in all 30 wards.

Each of these hubs is equipped with internet & smart devices, and training facilities, offering inclusive access to technology.

- Innovation & Entrepreneurship environment

The Dedan Kimathi University of Technology (DeKUT) is incubating ‘new-era’ solutions in agriculture technology (AgriTech), financial technology (FinTech), renewable energy, and even health systems.

It also hosts and supports a high-tech semiconductor production plant.



Additionally, grassroots innovation spaces such as Mt. Kenya Hub and Quo Vadis Youth Hub are offering training, mentorship, and workspace to the youth and entrepreneurs.

These facilities are known as incubators for tech entrepreneurs from both urban and rural communities, supporting everything from mobile applications to hardware prototyping.

-Specialized Concepts

Nyeri’s BPO sector is a fast-growing sector, mainly driven by the growing pool of digitally skilled youth. The County’s deliberate efforts to attract BPO firms are bearing fruit, with firms such as ONQ and Jitu Technologies setting up major operations there.

ONQ delivers medical & business outsourcing solutions to international clients,

providing hundreds of direct jobs to local youth.

Jitu Technologies has adopted a unique model of training rural software developers who deliver world-class software solutions for global tech platforms.

One of their gaming products, “Lane Wars” has even been published on Fortnite, demonstrating the potential of Nyeri’s software development talent on the global stage.

This sector presents scalable opportunities for job creation, exports, and foreign exchange generation, positioning Nyeri as an emerging digital labor hub within Kenya’s larger digital economy.

- Opportunities for investment & collaboration
Nyeri’s vision for a vibrant

digital economy offers a range of investment opportunities for private investors, donor agencies, technology providers, and academic institutions.

These include:

-Broadband Infrastructure: Strategic investments in last-mile broadband, data centers, and green ICT infrastructure to support rising data demands.

-Data centres: This is a major opportunity, given the current growth in our digital economy, driven by expanding high-speed internet penetration, cloud adoption, and business operation digitization.

-Digital Skills Training & Certification: Partnerships with global tech companies to offer certifications in coding, cybersecurity, AI, and blockchain.

-Startup Acceleration Programs: Venture capital funds, seed accelerators, and hackathons targeting innovations in AgriTech, FinTech, EduTech, and HealthTech.

-BPO Expansion: Establishment of digital labor zones, tech parks, and call centers for global outsourcing contracts.

-Digital Inclusion Projects: Support for programs targeting women in ICT, elderly access to services, and ICT use among persons with disabilities (PWDs).

Review of KIAMIS Project Progress in Nyeri

On behalf of the Nyeri Governor, H.E. Dr. Mutahi Kahiga, Deputy Governor David Kinaniri hosted FAO KAIMIS teams who were in Nyeri County for a field visit to review KIAMIS Project Progress and engage with farmers and stakeholders. KIAMIS, the Kenya Integrated Agriculture Management Information System, is a digital platform developed by Kenya's Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock Development to centralize farmer registration, manage input subsidies, provide e-extension services, and collect data to support sustainable farming and food security. The team was led by the Swedish Ambassador to Kenya, H.E. Håkan Åkesson accompanied by official Marie Ottosson. Others were FAO, and technical officers. The mission involved high-level engagements who visited selected participating farmers, and interac-



tions with one of the largest Nyeri County dairy cooperative factories. They provided an opportunity to highlight the Embassy of Sweden's support towards the KIAMIS project, including its activities, progress to date, and mid-term achievements. In addition, the donor engaged directly with farmers and cooperative managers to evaluate ongoing support to agriculture through KIAMIS, with an emphasis on showcasing how the system is benefiting counties and smallholder farmers. The objectives included showcasing farmer-level results from the KIAMIS system such as improved yields, increased dairy production from foliage, targeted integration with livestock traceability and uptake of KIAMIS linked government e-subsidy farmer targeting. The program will also emphasize inclusivity, highlighting the participation of women, youth, and persons with disabilities, while demonstrating how KIAMIS promotes circularity, climate-smart practices, and stronger coordination be-

tween county and national governments. Finally, the mission aimed to ensure visibility of Sweden's long-standing role in Kenya's agricultural development since independence. Sweden's contributions date back to the 1960s, including the introduction of improved dairy breeds, support to dairy training institutes, and cooperative models that inspired Kenya's dairy sector. Sweden remains the principal donor to KIAMIS to date, anchoring Kenya's digital agriculture transformation. Strategic messages will underscore KIAMIS as the backbone of the national subsidy system, tangible farmer impact stories, and the institutionalization of KIAMIS within counties. As the County Government of Nyeri, we remain committed to supporting this initiative, which will ensure more benefits to the farmers and increased access to agricultural services.

Margaret Macharia hosted a team from the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) who paid him a courtesy call. The delegation also included representatives from the Ministry of Agriculture, the

National Treasury, and the Embassy of Finland, alongside our own Department of Agriculture and other related officers. Their visit was to check and assess the progress of the Rural Kenya Financial Inclu-

sion Facility (RK-FINFA), a project jointly financed by IFAD and the Government of Kenya. RK-FINFA is a six-year initiative targeting 14 counties and 190,000 households through financing and capacity building, with a specific focus on youth and women. The team was in Nyeri to carry out ground work — assessing progress, identifying challenges, collecting recommendations, and most importantly, spending time with the farmers. After all, farmers are the direct beneficiaries of this project. Isn't the best feedback gathered from those living its impact every day? All of this was geared towards equipping beneficiaries to lead sustainable livelihoods and empowering communities to rise out of poverty. In addition, CGN was glad

to have received an Eight Million Euro grant from the Government of Finland, tailored specifically for youth. This support is aimed at making agriculture attractive to the younger generation, encouraging them to branch out, embrace self-employment, and see farming as a viable career. Nyeri County, being centered on agriculture as the main source of income for most households, deeply values such initiatives. Projects that uplift farmers and strengthen their productivity through their own farms are highly appreciated. KDSP II National Program Coordinating Unit Team visits DG

Nyeri Deputy Governor received the KDSP II National Program Coordinating Unit Team which was in Nyeri County to conduct a comprehensive Monitoring and Evaluation exercise to assess progress, identify challenges and provide technical assistance in the implementation of KDSP II. The team is conducting this exercise across all counties. The purpose of this exercise was to evaluate the extent of program implementation and the achievement of Disbursement Linked Indicators (DLIs). It also provided technical assistance by guiding and supporting County officials in executing KDSP II activities and strengthening M&E frameworks. Furthermore, the exer-



cise sought to document best practices by identifying successful models that may be replicated in other counties with a view to enhancing overall program performance and outcomes. The assessment looked into the three Key Result Areas. The three KRAs are; Sus-

tainable Financing and Expenditure Management, Intergovernmental Coordination, Institutional Performance, and Human Resource Management, and Oversight, Participation, and Accountability. Following an assessment for KDSP II in the last financial year, Nyeri County qualified for Ksh. 35.5 mil-

lion shillings. The money is however yet to be disbursed. The KDSP II team from the State Department of Devolution was led by Peter Akwala who is the KRA 1 focal person. Ann Wairimu, an Economist in the Planning Unit from SDD and Judy Agape from the National Program Co-

ordinating Unit KDSP II accompanied Peter, amongst other officials from SDD. The team engaged with the county officers (mostly the County Program Implementation Unit) involved in the KDSP II implementation.

Delivery of Medical Supplies to County Hospitals

The Department of Health successfully delivered a new consignment of essential medical supplies to major hospitals within the County. Among the facilities that received the supplies were:

- * Nyeri County Referral Hospital
- * Ihururu Treatment and Rehabilitation Hospital
- * Naromoru Level IV Hospital
- * Mukurweini Level IV Hospital

This replenishment exercise is part of the County's continued effort to strengthen the supply chain, enhance service delivery, and ensure uninterrupted access to



quality healthcare services for all residents.

The Department remains committed to the timely and

efficient distribution of supplies to all health facilities across the County.

Meanwhile, The Depart-

ment also undertook the replenishment of medical supplies at the County Stores, which serve as a buffer stock

for rural health facilities.

This initiative ensures continuity of essential medicines and medical commodities while awaiting subsequent orders.

In addition, the distribution of medical supplies to all hospitals and rural health facilities across the County continues regularly.

This exercise was aimed at strengthening service delivery and safeguarding uninterrupted access to quality healthcare for all residents.

The County Government of Nyeri remains committed to ensuring a reliable supply chain system as part of its broader mandate of promoting accessible and equitable healthcare.

The County Government of Nyeri remains committed to enhancing the health and well-being of its citizens.

This commitment is evident through continuous investments in strengthening healthcare infrastructure, including the upgrading and construction of modern hospitals.

In line with this, a joint site visit was conducted by the Department of Medical Services and Public Health together with the Department of Infrastructure and Public Works at

Mukurwe-ini Sub-County Hospital.

The visit focused on assessing Phase 1 of the ongoing construction works for the new Outpatient Block, which commenced in May 2025.

Once completed, this facility will greatly benefit the residents of Mukurwe-ini Sub-County and its environs by decongesting the existing unit and expanding the scope of healthcare services available.

At the same time, a team from the Department was also at the Wamagana

Health Centre grounds to inspect the ongoing construction of Tetu Level IV Hospital, which commenced on May 2025.

The project involves upgrading Wamagana Health Centre from a Level 3 to a Level 4 facility with a 150-bed capacity.

Once complete, the hospital will play a critical role in meeting the increasing demand for healthcare services, easing the workload at the facility, and decongesting Nyeri County Referral Hospital.

Male Medical Inreach at Karatina Level IV Hospital

The Department of Medical Services and Public Health, through the Mathira East Sub-County PCN Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) brought a special Male Wellness Clinic to Karatina Sub-County Hospital.

Men often shy away from hospitals, delaying care until it is too late.

This inreach broke that cycle, providing safe space and specialized care where men could openly seek help,

undergo urology consultation, prostate cancer screening, get screened for diabetes and hypertension, receive eye care, and consult with doctors on their wellbeing among other key medical services. This was more than just a clinic. It was a call to action: for men to take charge of their health, for families to encourage their fathers, brothers, and sons, and for the community to embrace preventive care as the

foundation of stronger, healthier lives.

8. Groups, companies, and cooperatives to provide minutes of resolution to borrow, their constitution or article of association.
9. Attach copies of ID, Pin Certificate, Tax Compliance, Business Permit
10. Attach Credit Reference Bureau report. Note: not clearance certificate
11. Any other supporting documents
